

Violence \dots

Sometimes we Americans worry too much about what others think of us. But a healthy regard for the opinions of others is a sign of a civilized man and a civilized society. So it is deeply disturbing to note that in the past few years the image of Americans as seen by Europeans has radically changed.

The change began, no doubt, with the assassination of President Kennedy. That so immensely popular and vital a young President could become the central figure in as grisly a murder as history has ever chronicled seemed shatteringly inconceivable to most Europeans.

A sun-baked Texas noon—that might be the setting for a Wild West cowboy-and-Indians movie charade, not for a modern-day tragedy of world-shaking dimensions.

But soon the Europeain press, radio and television were assessing the event in terms of our national character. And gradually the picture of happy, carefree, wealthy America, along with the slick, sleek creatures of Hollywood, began to fade.

Under the gaudy, satin surface was seen a trigge happy nation prone to reckless extremes, too impatter to await the salutations of law or time. For many Euro peans, this interprets our actions in Vietnam.

A ghastly chain of events in recent weeks—headed by the slaying of eight Chicago nurses and the sniper murders in Austin—have solidified the image of vio-lence. Newspapers abroad repeatedly express concern, as well they might, about the American fetish for guns.

They note that Queen Elizabeth and other heads of state ride to weddings and such in open carraiges at a stately pace, contrasting this to the speeding, bullet-proof car that whisked President Johnson and his daughter to her recent nuptials.

The network of Secret Service men guarding the first family has long puzzled Europeans, although they should be well aware that four of our Presidents have been assassinated and attempts have been made on the lives of three others. Lynda Johnson's protective escort during her recent trip to Spain and Germany, for example, was a source of ever-present irritation.

An air of foreboding about the American character and what it is capable of increasingly pervades the coments from abroad. Our European friends are fearful that they see a growing streak of violence in the most powerful nation on earth. And there are many on this side of the ocean who share those fears.

...and hate

Indeed, the cup of hate is running over in this country. Uglier by far than last year's confrontation at Selma or that summer's terrible outbreak in Watts was the riot of 1,000 white Catholic Americans in Chicago against a band of peaceful demonstrators for

It just must be the stilly season or clever Beatle press-agentry at work. Or did Lennon perhaps brush against a latent sense of guilt with his boast? As a Presbyterian clergyman in Madison, Wis., commented: "To many people today, the golf course also is more popular than Jesus."


